## **ADDENDUM TO STUDENT HANDBOOK**

### **Millington Middle School – Inclement Weather Dismissal Policy**

Dear Parents/Guardians:

In the event of inclement weather (heavy rain, lightning, thunderstorms, etc.) we will implement a revised dismissal policy. Our concerns are that students might fall on the muddy hill while running to the car, become soaked and there is also the threat of a lightning strike during a thunderstorm. For your child's safety, students will not be released outside to run to cars, climb the hill, walk in between buses, etc. because this is a safety concern.

In the event of inclement weather, we will dismiss students using the below listed procedure:

- + First, all bus riders will be dismissed to the cafeteria and will be loaded onto their buses.
- + Secondly, walkers will be dismissed and escorted to the crosswalk by staff members and directed across the street by the crossing guard.
- + Lastly, all car riders will be placed in the cafeteria and parents will be directed to pull into the main (lower level) parking lot and as you pull up to the main entrance, your child's name will be called and the student(s) will be sent outside to load the vehicle.

*\* Please make sure you communicate all of the names of the students you are picking up so that the line can move quickly and not be delayed.*

Parents will be able to check students out prior to 1:30 p.m. However, once dismissal has started parents will no longer be allowed to check students out and must pick up students in the carpool line.

We appreciate your continued patience with us during this school year as we ensure your child's safety to and from school.
