## 1 General

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- The Board shall provide for a system-wide testing program which shall be periodically reviewed and evaluated. The purposes of the program shall be to:
  - 1. Assist in promoting accountability;
  - 2. Determine the progress of students;
  - 3. Assess the effectiveness of the instructional program and student learning;
  - 4. Aid in counseling and guiding students in planning future education and other endeavors;
- 5. Analyze the improvements needed in each instructional area;
  - 6. Assist in the screening of students with learning difficulties;<sup>1</sup>
    - 7. Assist in placing students in remedial programs;
- 8. Provide information for college entrance and placement; and
- 9. Assist in educational research by providing data.<sup>2</sup>
- The Director of Schools shall be responsible for planning and implementing the program, which includes:
- 1. Determining specific purposes for each test;
  - 2. Selecting the appropriate test to be given;
  - 3. Establishing procedures for administering the tests;
- 29 4. Making provisions for interpreting and disseminating the results;
  - 5. Maintaining testing information in a consistent and confidential manner; and
- 6. Ensuring that results are obtained as quickly as possible, especially when placement in a special learning program might be necessary.

- 1 State-mandated student testing programs shall be undertaken in accordance with procedures published
- 2 by the State Department of Education.<sup>3</sup>

## 3 WEIGHTING TCAP SCORES

- 4 TNReady<sup>4</sup> and EOC<sup>5</sup> scores shall be included in students' final grades during the spring semester as
- 5 follows:
- 6 a) Grades 3-5 15%
- 7 b) Grades 6-8 15%
- 8 c) Grades 9-12 15%
- 9 The "Target Score Methodology" will be the method used to calculate student TCAP/EOC scores.
- The Director of Schools may exclude these scores from students' final grades if results are not received
- by the district at least five (5) instructional days before the end of the course.<sup>4,5</sup>

## 12 INTEREST INVENTORIES AND CAREER ASSESSMENTS<sup>6</sup>

- 13 Interest inventories shall be made available to 9<sup>th</sup> graders. These will include assessments such as the
- 14 Kuder assessment, Myers-Briggs Type Indicator, the ASVAB, or the College Board Career Finder.
- 15 Career aptitude assessments shall be administered to 7<sup>th</sup> graders in order to inform the student's high
- school plan of study.

## 17 TESTING INFORMATION AND PARENTAL CONSENT

- Any test directly concerned with measuring student ability or achievement through individual or group
- 19 psychological or socio-metric tests shall not be administered by or with the knowledge of any employee
- of the system without first obtaining written consent of the parent(s)/guardian(s).<sup>2</sup>
- 21 Results of all group tests shall be recorded on students' permanent records and shall be made available
- 22 to appropriate personnel in accordance with established procedures.<sup>7</sup>
- No later than July 31<sup>st</sup> of each year, the Board shall publish on its website information related to state
- 24 and board mandated tests that will be administered during the school year. The information shall
- 25 include:<sup>8</sup>

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- 26 1. The name of the test;
- 28 2. The purpose and use of the test;
- 30 3. The grade or class in which the test will be administered;
- 4. The tentative date or dates that the test will be administered;

- 5. The time and manner in which parent(s)/guardian(s) and students will be notified of the results 1 of the test: 2 3 6. How parent(s)/guardian(s) can access the questions and answers on their student's state-4 5 required tests; and 6 7. If a board mandated test, how the test complements and enhances student instruction and 7 learning and how it serves a purpose distinct from state-required tests. 8 9 Testing information shall also be placed in student handbooks or other school publications that are provided to parent(s)/guardian(s) on an annual basis. 10 Legal References Cross References 1.
